



## Full-time Research Assistant Position at Northeastern University

Project: Online misinformation and how to correct it

Objectives: Belief in misinformation can have serious ramifications, particularly when the misinformation is regarding life threatening conditions such as cancer. The overarching goal of this study is to investigate (1) why people share misinformation online, (2) how people update their beliefs when misinformation is corrected, (3) what are the psychological mechanisms of this belief updating, and (4) how deep fakes influence belief in misinformation.

Description: We are looking for a highly motivated research assistant to join our interdisciplinary team and be involved in all aspects of our innovative misinformation studies. In particular, the research assistant will assist in programming experiments, data collection (for example recruiting participants online), data analysis, literature reviews, and preparing manuscripts. There will be opportunities to present work at both local and international conferences. This position will be based at Northeastern University in Boston, USA. We are looking for someone who can start ASAP for a one-year position, with the option of a second year.

Background required: College degree in psychology or related field and interest in making a career in research. Previous research experience preferred.

Skills: The candidate must be conscientious, have excellent people skills, and have an understanding of statistics. Knowledge of programs such as R are a plus.
